The GIS database used for these maps, was based on information provided by the 'Atlas of Florida', published by the University Press of Florida in 1992. As it can be seen from the maps, Florida's present sixty-seven counties evolved from two counties (St. Johns and Escambia). They were established by Andrew Jackson in 1821. Alachua County was established in December 29, 1824 comprising initially present-day's Levy and Gilchrist counties. It was in December 4, 1925 that Alachua County took the shape it has today, with the establishment of Gilchrist, the 67th county.
